Generation 1

 WILLIAM¹ DALTON was born about 1786 in Owning Townland, Co. Kilkenny, Ireland. He died before 1838 in Rear of Knoydart, Maple Ridge, Antigonish County, Nova Scotia, Canada. He married Alice Fitzgerald on 16 Jun 1822 in St John's Basilica, Newfoundland and Labrador, Canada. She was born about 1795 in Owning Townland, Co. Kilkenny, Ireland. She died after 1871 in Rear of Knoydart, Maple Ridge, Antigonish County, Nova Scotia, Canada.



Notes for William Dalton:

William Dalton was born about or before 1795 in Owning Townland, County Kilkenny, Ireland. Landed in St John's, Newfoundland and Labrador in 1822. There, he married Alice Fitzgerald also from his hometown on 16 Jun 1822. Together, they emigrated to Antigonish, Nova Scotia, in July of 1822. He had four sons and one daughter with Alice between 1823 and 1833. On 23rd of August 1822, William Dalton petitioned for a land grant at Knoydart, near Arisaig, Antigonish County, Nova Scotia. On the 30 March 1829, he is found with his parcel of land on the map of Knoydart, Antigonish County Nova Scotia. He died there before the 1838 census in Antigonish County, Nova Scotia, at the age of about 43.

The surname Dalton was first found in Alton, England where one source claims a Walter fled to "from France having incurred the wrath of the French king by secretly marrying his daughter."[1] Another source has a clearer version of origin, namely: "that Sir Waltero de Aliton, a Frenchman, aspiring to gain the affections of his king's daughter, so incurred the displeasure of her father, that, to avoid the fury of an incensed Monarch, Sir Walterio, with his lady, privately, retired into Ireland." This same Walterio fought so valiantly that he was made "governor of the borders of Meath" where he "acquired great estates and possessions." [2] Essentially, the origins are similar; Walter (Walterio) fled with the king's daughter to England (Ireland.) We will probably never know which rendition is true, but we do know that the surname was in Ireland as early as the 13th century, so much so that the name had a Gaelic version: Dalatún.

William Dalton petitioned for land at rear of Knoydart, Antigonish County, Nova Scotia 23 August 1822.

The Irish name for Owning is Ónainn.

County Kilkenny Ireland History

The Daton Family Early Documented History

In the Calendar of Ormond Deeds, the first mention of Daton, with a County Kilkenny connection, appears as a witness of a release and quit-claim to Sir Edmund le Botiller [Butler] in the manor and barony of Cnoketothyr [Knocktopher]. Hugh Datoun, knight, was among the witnesses of this grant, dated February 28, 1314, and given at Dublin.

The Ormond Deeds mention a number of Datouns in records recorded about 1359, including the following names Richard Datoun, knight; Peter Datoun and John Dauton; Richard Dalton and John Roth Dalton; Richard son of John Dalton; and Richard son of James Datoun.

A Walter son of Richard Dantoun, knight, is recorded as a witness, on September 6, 1375, of lands in the lordship of Overk [Iverk], Co. Kilkenny. A Richard Dantoun is cited in an earlier deed, dated November, 1352, at an

undisclosed place.

Another entry in this work records that "Walter Datoun quit-claims to James, Earl of Ormond, all his right in all lands, tenements, rents, etc., in the lordships of Kildras, Correstoun and Metlagh in county Kilkenny." This grant was given at Waterford, dated December 24, 1379, and indicates the Datons had possesed a number of properties in south central County Kilkenny.

In the Court roll of the manor of Kilcrone [Co. Kilkenny], circa 1400, listed among the suitors of the court of Kilcrone is a Raymond Daton for [rent of] Balikarrowill.

NOTE: Raymond and Redmund are often used as the same name.

In November, 1419, a Henry Datoun is listed among the jurors at an inquisition at Corbaliesford which outlined the parcels of royal service divided between the Barony of Knocktopher and the Newtown of Jerpoint (Co. Kilkenny).

On July 18, 1438, is recorded a deed of attorney by Raymond fitz Walter Datoun appointing Nocholas fitzElys Datoun his bailiff for placing Richard fitz Redmund de Valle and Joan his wife in full seisin of a townland called Atheny near of Lynnan in county Tipperary, to have and to hold to them and the heirs male between them begotten. Given at Castleton.

Dated August 31, 1446 is a deed of attorney of Anastasia Daton, daughter and heir of John Daton, appointing Nicholas MacElyot her bailiff for delivery to Geoffrey Vale (albeit, de Valle), chaplain, full seisin of all her lands, etc. in counties Kilkenny, Tipperary and elsewhere. Given at Henberyeston.

In a record dated about 1453, the estate of Redmund fitz Walter Daton is enumerated, as lands in: "Castletown, Whytchurch, Newtoune, Ballnemeale alias Kyllomory, Newgraige, two acres in Garrynerchy, Kylmedally, Ballyfoyle, Ballyen, Bremill, Rogeristown, Cloghistare, Twor Portenshe (?), Liclaman, Twor Dowlinge, Cowlerve, Ballybeataghe, Fencockstowne, Tomynstowne, and a plot (plac') from Kylteran which estate bears date xxo die Octobris anno regni Regis Henrici quarti post conquestum Anglie (blank)."
"In which estate the revercioun of the lands which Margaret the wife of said Walter had in dower was likewise past."

The record goes on to cite that "Redmund Daton had issue Robert and Redmund [fitz Redmund]. Robert past forty acres with their appurtenances called Mone Rothe in tenemento de Owning to his second brother Patrick and his heirs." The record appears to show the descent of Richard fitz Redmund to his son, Patrick fitz Richard Daton, and then to his grandson Walter fitz Patrick Daton, and finally that Walter [fitz Patrick] Daton had issue John Daton fitz Walter. In the mix, it cites an estate in tayle from Richard fitzPatricke Daton to his son Patrick fitzRichard Daton of the land of Moynroo (presumably Mone Rothe above), dated February 1533, and that the heir of this Patricke fitz Richard is to be sought out.

On January 16, 1453, the grant from Robert son of Redmund Datoun to Patrick son of Redmund Datoun is recorded. He granted Patrick firty acres of land which are called "Monrothe" in the tenement of Unynge. Among the witnesses were Richard Datoun and Redmund fitzJohn.

In an indenture dated September 12, 1457, it cites Robert Datown, William Datown, Patrick Datown and Richard Datown, the sons of Redmund Datown, late lord of the Datowns. It goes on to describe Robert as lord and heir of the Datowns.

On December 21, 1492, Redmund (Redmundus) Datoun, lord of Cillmogulla,

Cillcrispine and Athena, in the counties Kilkenny and Tipperary, gives and grants to John son of Peter Butler his tenements of Cillcrispyne and Athene on the west side of Lyucan and Sliabhdile in the county Tipperary with all its tenements, lands, woods, plains, mills, etc., and all free liberties pertaining thereto, to him and his heirs forever. In the accompanying quit-claim of this transaction, Redmund Datoun is described as captain of his nation. NOTE: According to Hogan's Onomasticon Goidelicum Sliabh Dil is the hilly region east of Slievenamon in county Tipperary, extending to Carrick-on-Suir, and in county Kilkenny to Windgap and to Owning near Pilltown. Ahenna, Kilclipsin and Garryduff of county Tipperary are in it, so are Curraghmore and Cahernane of county Kilkenny.

The Datons of Kildaton

The following passage comes from Carrigan's History and Antiquities of the Diocese of Ossory and entitled "The Datons of Kildaton."

The name Daton, or D'Autun, now incorrectly written Dalton, appears in Kilkenny records as early as 1382, in which year Walter Daton and others were appointed Keepers of the Peace in said County (source: Patent Rolls). John fitz Redmund Daton was appointed to the same office in 1425. On the 20th Dec., 1516, McRedmond Daton, chief of his nation, and lord of Cyllecyspine and Athene (Kilclispeen and Ahenny), in the Co. Tipperary, granted John fitz Peter le Botiller all right, &c., which he had in his (Daton's) demesne of Cillcrispyne and Athene, on the west side of the Lyneam (i.e. Lingaun river), in the Co. Tipperary (source: Graves's MSS.). About 1565 "Daton and his kinsmen's landes houlden of the mannour of the Grannagh" were estimated at 100 marks (I66 13s. 4d.).

What date the family settled at Kilmodalla, or Kildaton, now Bessborough, is unknown. In a document of 1592, the townland is called "Daton's Kill," which shows that in that year, at least, the Datons were well established here. In the same year died William Daton of Kildaton, chief of his nation. His will, dated Nov. 15th, 1592, and proved the 6th of January, 1592-93, is as follows:

"In Dei nomine. Amen. In the yere of out Lord 1592 and the 15 of November, I, William Daten being sicke in body and whole in minde and in full memory, dith make my last will and testament in presence of God and holy church. Item. I bequeath my soul to Almightie God and to all the holy company of heaven, and my body to the earth to be buried in the chapple of Kilmoygall. And I make my wife Margaret Butler and my sonne Edmund Daton mu executors of this my last will and testament. Itm. more I will and ordayne all my goodss moveable and unmoveable in iii equal porcions that is to saie one parte to my wife, the seconf parte to my children and the third part to my soule. Itm. all my goods moveable is 6 cables and one kowe and 8 and 20 shepe and the valewe of xvteen. sh[illings] of iron and brasse."

Edmund Daton, son and heir of William, was 25 years old at the time of his father's death, and was, therefore, born in 1567. He died Aug. 1st. 1629, and was buried with his ancestors "in the chapel of Kilmadalie." By his wife, Margaret, daughter of GErald Blanchville of Blanchvillestown, whom he had married before Nov., 1592, he left issue: -- Walter, his heir, John, on whom he settled Whitechurch and New Graig; Edward; Oliver; William; Theobald; Margaret; Catherine; Elizabeth; and Allan.

Walter, the eldest son and heir, was of full age at his father's death, and married to Ellice, sister of Richard, 3rd Viscount Mountgarret. He was still living in 1641, but died within the next dozen years.

Edmund Daton, his successor and, presumably, his son, forfeited, in 1653, the faimly estates, which, according to the Down Survey Books, then comprised the townlands of Kildaton (a castle), Curloghan, Tubernabrone and Lisnagenny, Ballaghdowlin, Ballagh[na]metagh, Jamestown, Gorheen and Bannagher.

"William Daton, of Kildaton, Esq.," probably the representative of Edmund, was outlawed and attainted by the Williamites, Apr. 20th, 1691. Other members of the family outlawed in the same day were: Walter Daton, of Kilonasbog, Esq.: Walter Daton, of Garrynerehy, gent.; Redmond Daton, of Kilenasbog, gent.; and William Daton, of the City of Kilkenny, gent. (afterwards Bishop of Ossory)

Kildaton Castle sttod on a low ridge or mound, about 250 yeards, east of Bessborough House. It was taken down soon after the erection of the present mansion, which dates from 1744.

In Irish, Daton is pronounced Dhawthoon. The Irish of Kildaton or Bessborough is Kyle-a-Dhawthoona, i.e. Daton's Kill or Church.

Notes for Alice Fitzgerald:

Piltown also has a unique place in English history as it was the only place on the island of Ireland to see a battle in the Wars of the Roses. In the Battle of Piltown (1462) Thomas FitzGerald, 7th Earl of Desmond, on the side of the House of York, defeated the Butlers of Kilkenny, fighting for the House of Lancaster, resulting in more than 400 casualties for the Butlers.[6] Local folklore claims that the battle was so violent that the local river ran red with blood, hence the names Pill River and Piltown (Baile an Phuill - Town of the blood).

The township of Morristown was established in 1856. It was probably named after John Morris who had surveyed the farms in the district. Among the first grantees were Nathaniel Roy Thomas, Mrs. Sarah Thomas and Benjamin Ogden. About 1800 immigrants from the Highlands began to arrive in the district and to buy the farms of the former loyalist soldiers. Among these Highland immigrants were Angus Ban McGillivray and William McGillivray of Arisaig, Scotland, Ewan McGillivray and Angus and John McIsaac, Angus Kennedy and Donald, Angus and Alexander MacDonald.

There was a school there in 1827 and a new school-house was built about 1880.

There was a postal way office from 1855 to 1867. The population in 1956 was 89.

On the passage Captain Dalton sighted scarcely a speck of ice, only a small scattering off Cape North. Left William "Ditto" Dalton and on the right Peter Owen "Peachie" Carroll, Pictou's police chief, were both flamboyant, well-known Pictou characters in the early 1900s. They both appreciated good hunting dogs, and Ditto Dalton was a breeder. He also had a goat trained to walk a tightrope. William "Ditto" Dalton, born 16 May 1867 Pictou, son of James Dalton and Elizabeth MacDonald. He is standing in front of his business with his arms folded in 1890. "Ditto" ran the Red Onion, a popular watering hole of the late 1800s and early 1900s. To run a liquor establishment in those days of Prohibition involved some ingenuity in finding loop-holes in anti-alcohol legislation. Could it be that Ditto's best buddy was Peter Owen Carroll the town's police chief? Peter "Peachie" Carroll had written a song about The Red Onion. The saloon was situated where the deCoste Entertainment Centre parking lot is today.

"The History of Miscou, Tracadie, Pokemouche, Caraquet, Tabusintac, Nguac and Burnt Church", W. F. Ganong:

"Cassidy was son of an Irishman who worked for a Laird in Scotland and eloped to America with his daughter, as it is said."

[Ganong's say-so does not make Cassidy's father-in-law a member of titled nobility, nor his wife necessarily a "Lady", in the aristocratic sense. Somewhat more definite proof is needed before that conclusion can be made. 'Laird' could be any large landowner, and Lady was a courtesy title to a daughter of a titled noble when she had no title of her own.]

Jack Cassidy, in an e-mail dated 25SEP2002, gives another suggestion. He refers to brothers, John and James Cassidy, Irish Protestants, who settled first in Pictou Co., NS ca, 1789. John m. Margaret Turnbull, and James m. Martha Turnbull, Margaret's sister, daughters of Thomas and Jean (or Jane) (MacKay) Turnbull. Amongst James' children were: James who eventually d. 1880 in Newcastle, NB, John b. ca. 1800, Andrew b. ca. 1802 and William b. ca. 1803. Jack Cassidy suggests that John, s/o James, might be the same John Cassidy who m. Mary Anderson. His reasons for believing this are:

- i. John Cassidy's headstone in Burnt Church gives his birthplace as Nova Scotia, and an obituary in the, Union Advocate, February, 1872, states he was "a Native of Pictou, Nova Scotia". His obit was also carried by the, Presbyterian Witness, Halifax.
- ii. The names of the children of John and Mary (Murray) Cassidy, James of Pictou Co. and his son. also James, all included: Martha, James, John, Andrew, William, Mary and Margaret. iii. James Cassidy, his sons; James, John and William, and his nephew, John Cassidy, s/o John, were all mentioned as being in the 1825 Miramichi Fire. "This information is derived from the NB Archives via the Miramichi Fire List recording losses due to the fire, and from the newspaper, Miramichi Mercury, which published a list of letters unclaimed in the Miramichi Post Office in 1826."
- iv. "I have copies of Land Petitions for James Cassidy (1827), John Cassidy (1826) and William Cassidy (1827) from the NB Archives. At those times, all are recently married my James (ggrandfather) was first married (he married twice) in 1824; his brother John about 1825, (1st child Martha, if he is John of Burnt Church, was born April 18, 1826), and his brother William 1925/1826. Of interest is the spelling of Cassidy in one part of John Cassidy's land petition CASADY the same as the spelling in the 1817 Pictou census. John's land petition (F-4203) at that time was for 200 acres on the Great Nepisiguit River. The petition also says John had been in NB for 3 years in 1826. Interestingly, John of Burnt Church entered NB in 1823 per the 1851 census."
- vi. Lady Elizabeth MacKay (or variations) is said to have run from Scotland to marry one of her father's employees. Jack Cassidy relates: "Thomas Turnbull and Jean (Jane) MacKay arrived on PEI in 1774 from Scotland on the vessel Lovely Nelly. In 1775 they relocated to Pictou. On the 'Lovely Nelly' passenger list is given the reason the Turnbulls left Scotland which was "run away from this place", as a similar tradition.

added to this, Jack wrote in a query dated 22JUN2004:

John Cassidy (b.1757 Ireland, d.1842, Magdelan Islands, Quebec, Canada) arrived in Pictou, Nova Scotia in 1788/89 with a group of Lowland Scots on a vessel from Dumfriesshire, Scotland. That he was Irish is proven by his headstone in Canada - "In Memory of JOHN CASSIDY, Schoolmaster, a native of Ireland, died November 28, 1842, aged 85 years." No knowledge as to why he sailed from Scotland. He was married by Presbytarian Clergy, in Pictou in 1793 per Pictou marriage records. His brother JAMES CASSIDY also came to Pictou, either with John or later. James married in Pictou abt. 1796/97 based on birth of first child in 1798. They married Margaret and Martha Turnbull respectively, who were sisters. John and James both named their first born son - JAMES, suggesting perhaps their father was a James.

Elsewhere, Jack refers to a work, A History of the County of Pictou, Nova Scotia, written in 1877 by The Rev. George Patterson.

Elva Connors (11FEB2003) added information on the children of John and Mary Cassidy.

Possibly the reference to a brother may have something to do with an entry on the 25MAY1861

edition of the Chatham, "The Gleaner and Northumberland Schediasma", which has an entry abstracted as:

"d. At his residence, Lower District, Newcastle parish (North. Co.), 18th inst., Robert Simpson, Sr., age 75, native of Parish of Speymouth, Morayshire, Scotland. Emigrated to this Country in 1830."

This Robert Simpson (ca. 1786-1861) would seem, however, to have been more likely a father than brother. Robert Simpson, in Newcastle Parish in 1851, was b. ca. 1788, arrived 1830 and had a wife, Margaret (Sinclair), b. ca. 1798. While it is unlikely that Margaret could be James' mother a connection appears to exist as James Simpson's household is listed next to Robert Simpson's in 1851. The next household, after Robert's, is that of Alexander (ca. 1790) and Margaret [81] (ca. 1800) Stewart where Margaret is Janet's sister. Clearly Robert and James Simpson were connected in some way.

William Simpson [76A] mentioned above was from Rothes, Morayshire, Scotland. Also from Rothes, Morayshire, Scotland was Henry Simpson (b. ca. 1778, d. Newcastle 9MAY1859 age 81 years.) James Simpson, and apparently a brother, Robert Simpson, seem connected to Henry as "Henery" headed the household largely consisting of Robert Simpson and his family. It seems as if Henry Simpson was likely an elder brother to Robert Simpson, and according to a death notice and the 1851 census, arrived before them in 1802-3. While it seems inescapable that Henry (ca. 1778), Robert (ca. 1786), James (ca. 1808-9) and William Simpson (b. Rothes, Morayshire, Scotland 30OCT1802, bpt. Elgin Parish 7NOV1802, d. Burnt Church, NB 22APR1884, bur. Old Burnt Church Cem., Burnt Church, Alnwick Parish, Northumberland Co., NB), s/o Joseph (1775-1846) and Janet (Ogilvie) Simpson are somehow related the relationships seem to be of a slightly extended family. Henry Simpson seems to have been a bachelor, a! nd likely was a brother to Robert and possibly James. William Simpson (b. 1802) is given as his nephew. Henery Simspon and William's father, Joseph J. Simpson, are given as sons of Archibald and Elspeth (Scott) Simpson.

In November, 1914, Lieutenant-Colonel T. M. Seely, of Yarmouth, N.S., was commissioned to organize a field artillery battery for overseas service to represent the maritime provinces in the Canadian Expeditionary Force. This battery was to be mobilized at Fredericton, N.B. About the middle of the month Lieutenant-Colonel Seely arrived in Fredericton. He had as officers - Captain E. A. Chisholm, of Antigonish, N.S.; and Captain J. K. MacKay, of Pictou, N.S., and Lieutenant R. V. Jones, of Woodstock, N.B. as Lieutenants. With this staff of efficient Officers, Lieutenant-Colonel Seely set to work. Men were enlisted by the several recruiting officers at the various field artillery headquarters throughout the maritime provinces. Lieutenant Irvine, of Fredericton, was the Medical Examiner, and L. A. Fullerton, of Annapolis Royal, N.S., was the Orderly Room Sergeant.

In a very short time the full number of men required was enlisted. They were quartered in the Fredericton Exhibition Buildings, which had been fitted up as a temporary barracks. The men were clothed in khaki field service uniforms, and the city began to have its old time appearance as a military depot. Yet Fredericton, though always accustomed to having soldiers stationed there, was experiencing a new sensation. These men were not the usual type of soldiers the city knew, but the very best of brain and youth, which the glorious old maritime provinces could produce. They were new to the military life, but all were possessed with determination to be taught and drilled, that they might become efficient in order to cope with the difficult task that lay before them. They were not men who had become soldiers for neither a steady job nor an easy life, but men who were making great sacrifices at home that the honor and principles of our glorious empires should be upheld.

Among the first to enlist was Holly H. Patchell, of St. John, N.B., a man of considerable experience in both cavalry and artillery work. He was appointed Sergeant-Major, and to him fell the task of drilling and instilling military discipline into the men. In this capacity he proved a great success and was ably assisted by Quartermaster-Sergeant B. Cameron, who had formerly been Sergeant-Major of the Eighteenth Field Battery, of Antigonish. Later Quartermaster-Sergeant Cameron was made Riding Instructor, and was succeeded in the Quartermaster-Sergeancy by Frank X. Jennings, of St. John, N.B.

About the 1st of December a great many students of the University of New Brunswick enlisted. This attracted the notice of other maritime Universities, whose students began to enroll. Soon the battery became known as the University Battery. From these students a number of very efficient non-commissioned Officers were developed, Sergeants - N. D. Cass, T. c. Barker and G. F. Kuhring; Corporals - J. P. Hipwell, G. B. Alexander and B. McInerney; Bombardiers - C. B. Burden, H. A. De Veber, J. W. McCandless, W. J. Lawson, F. J. MacGibbon, C. D. Otty, A. M. James, N. A. McKenzie and J. I. Morrison becoming the most prominent.

The recruiting had been carried on at such a pace that Lieutenant-Colonel Seely found himself with almost double the number of men required. The military authorities were quick to recognize this valuable material and soon orders were issued for the formation another battery. These two batteries were numbered Twenty-three and Twenty-four and formed the Second division of the Sixth Brigade, C.F.A., commanded by Lieutenant-Colonel E. W. Rathbun. On December 17th, Lieutenant Colonel B. A. Ingraham, of Sydney, N.S., arrived to take command of the Twenty-fourth Battery.

While the Batteries were stationed at Fredericton the people of the city gave them a most hospitable reception. Dances, teas, concerts, sleigh drives, suppers and parties were organized for the boys. At Christmas and New Year's, seasonable treats and dinners were provided by the citizens and were thoroughly enjoyed.

Several changes were made among the Officers of the Twenty-third Battery; Lieutenant-Colonel Seely, whose organization ability had been early recognized by the department, was commissioned to raise a batter for the defense of the wireless station at Barrington, N.S.. Captain J. K. MacKay, who had proved himself to be one of the ablest artillery Officers in Canada, was appointed Officer Commanding the battery, and Lieutenant R. V. Jones, a young and efficient Officer, having resigned his commission to go in the ranks, John E. Read, of Halifax, N. S., and John N. McEachern, of Souris, P.E.I., were made Lieutenants.

During the winter the Batteries were inspected by Major-General The Honourable Sam Hughes, Minister of Militia and Defense, Lieutenant-Colonel Rathbun, and Major-General Rutherford, General Officer Commanding Sixth Division. Such progress had been made by the Brigade that they received orders to proceed to England at once.

On February 18th the Batteries left Fredericton. A civic reception committee waited on the men and farewell speeches were made by the Mayor of Fredericton, the Premier of New Brunswick, the Earl of Ashburnham and others. The ladies of Fredericton provided dainty but substantial lunches for the overland trip, and numerous individual presentations were made before leaving.

Headed by the Fredericton Brass Band, the troops marched to the I.C.R. station and entrained for Halifax. The citizens had turned out en masse and gave the boys a warm and hearty send-off.

At Halifax they boarded the White Star liner Megantic, and sailed on February 22nd. Arriving at Queenstown, Ireland, a two days' stop was made in the harbor; then the Megantic, escorted by two torpedo boat destroyers, was driven full speed to Liverpool through the danger zone of the German submarine blockade. Another day found the Twenty-third Battery comfortably quartered in Moore Barracks, Shorncliffe Camp, Kent. Here the real training for war began in earnest and soon this battery was sending men to the firing line. On an inspection by the Chief Gunnery Instructor, Lieutenant-Colonel Battiscombe, an Imperial Officer who had spent all his life in artillery work, the Twenty-third Battery had the distinction of being declared fit to proceed to the Front at once.

Shortly afterwards they were removed to Ross Barracks, and on May 28th, Major MacKay sailed for France; with him went a draft of three hundred and thirty six men, including practically all the Twenty-third Battery. Those left behind were to act as instructors and base details for the Reserve. No doubt they will all be in France by the time of publication.

The Battery has been all drafted to the Second Brigade, Canadian Field Artillery and the Divisional Ammunition Column in France.

Any further record of the Battery will be available only at the close of the war. Doubtless the names of the Twenty-third Battery will go down in history; their deeds will be a credit and add glory to their native land. The newer generations will look with pride upon the part taken in the great war by the Field Artillery Batteries from the Maritime provinces.




