For each answer, you must state your argument, framed as an answer to the question (I argue that [position] because [reasons]); and provide evidence (from the readings and in-class discussion; please include specifics rather than generalities) and explain how it supports your position, having a paragraph for each reason you gave; and to sum up in a conclusion. You will be marked on the quality of your argument, the quality of your evidence and the quality of the presentation.

Example question:

Compare and contrast how Schiller (**Merchants in the City of Art**) and Sikkink (“Home sweet market stand: Work, gender and getting ahead among Bolivian traditional medicine vendors”) discuss the role of family for the market vendors they discuss. Should children be involved in their parents’ business?
