Small assignment: Seventeenth Annual Global Issues Forum

TOPIC: Sustainable Development Goals

In 2015, all member countries of the United Nations signed an agreement to work towards achieving 17 Sustainable Development Goals by 2030. These goals replace the 8 Millennium Development Goals, named in honour of the transition into the third millennium, and that outlined targets that were to have been met by 2015. The SDGs prioritize measures to address poverty, inequality, climate, environmental degradation, prosperity, and peace and justice, and are intended to apply to all countries. They were developed through a working group of 30 members representing 70 member countries and through consultation with civil society groups. In contrast, the MDGs addressed only the Global South, and were developed by a committee of experts.*

QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION:

- 1) In what ways might the SDGs provide a promising path to end global poverty and inequality, and to address climate change?
- 2) In what ways might they veil historical power imbalances, and thus perpetuate these for the future?

Explanation of logistics for the forum:

Students will sit in groups of eight, reflecting the different disciplines present.

- Part 1: Students will locate their groups and watch the video excerpt (15 minutes).
- Part 2. Each small group will examine the questions (45 minutes).
- Part 3. A collective discussion, in which students and faculty raise key points and questions raised in small groups, follows the group discussions (15 minutes).

Submit: a 150- 250 word response to the topic questions, summarizing your opinion AFTER you have attended the forum. Refer specifically to insights from at least two other forum attendees, as well as the videos.
